Faculty Development Programme on Forecasting for Planning and Policy Making

(28 July - 2 August 2025)

INTRODUCTION

Forecasting is a technique where past data is relied on to predict future planning and decision making. Forecasting plays a vital role in planning and policy making. Prediction of key variables in research and planning is of utmost importance for precise and timely decision making. For example, forecasting sales, prices, budget allocations based on historical values of actuals etc., provides the basis for planning for required resources or for possible future expansion decisions. Forecasting accuracy guided by statistical fundamentals and tools are key to success in achieving precision in forecasting for pragmatic policy decisions.

The programme will cover issues related to planning and policy making with special focus on education and economic development. Education plays a key role in ensuring economic development in all nations. Education equips individuals with the knowledge, skill and capabilities necessary for accessing better economic opportunities, driving innovation and becoming a productive workforce. The Sustainable Development Goals laid down by the United Nations also keep education as one of the key determinants for economic development.

Forecasting can help the education sector and the nation in tackling the challenges and fulfilling objectives by guiding the sector with well-grounded results. The current directives require all higher education institutions to develop institutional development plans (IDPs). Forecasting techniques can help in developing robust and reliable IDPs be it for predicting future enrollment numbers, budgeting for HEIs or understanding what challenges lie ahead for higher education institutes under the changing higher education landscape.

The FDP aims to provide a detailed discussion on the different tools and techniques that can be used for impactful academic research and publications involving quantitative approach. The workshop will provide a hands-on experience in data analysis on free software like Excel worksheets, and basic step-by-step guides on how to use the powerful software R.

The FDP will also help the participants interpret and understand the results and discussion and how to structure the quantitative papers.

THEMES

The Faculty Development Programme shall address to but not be limited to the following areas:

- 3. Importance of Forecasting in Development Models

- 6. Basic statistical concepts, types of forecasting methods, choosing forecasting models, forecasting with linear regression using software (Excel, R)
- 7. Hands on learning step-by-step of statistical software R
- 8. Visualization of data
- 9. Discussion and resolution of specific research problems

OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAMME

The salient objectives of the Programme:

- ❖ To provide an overview of NEP 2020 and role of higher education for sustainable development
- ❖ To orient the participants towards forecasting for planning and policy making in education and development
- ❖ To equip them to handle data and use it for developing robust and reliable policy
- ❖ To equip them with the skill of using relevant and latest statistical software for research and forecasting techniques.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- The participants will gain insight into the relationship between higher education and Sustainable Development
- ❖ The participants will appreciate the importance of research in fostering sustainable development and quality education
- The participants will be able to conduct quality research with an interdisciplinary approach.
- They will be able to conduct research in a scientific manner by using forecasting methods and effectively analyze the data through software (Excel and R).
- They will be competent to report their research outcomes impressively and generate quality publications

EVALUATION & CERTIFICATION

The Assessment of the Programmes will be as follows:

i. Two tests of MCQs (30 marks each = 60 marks) +

- ii. ICT-based Micro teaching/ assignments (20 marks) +
- iii. Overall response (20 marks).

Grading and Certification shall be as follows:

- (i) A+: 85 percent and above
- (ii) A: 70 percent to 84 percent
- (iii) B: 60 percent to 69 percent
- (iv) C: 50 percent to 59 percent
- (v) Those participants who score less than 50 marks will not be given a certificate. Participants have to repeat the course at their own expenditure.

No leave shall be permissible except for emergencies or exceptional case/circumstances where a maximum of 3-day leave may be granted by Programme Director of the MMTTC. Participants who avail such leave will have to compensate for the same number of days in the next programme, and such participants may be given a certificate after completion of the course.

This Short-Term Course / FDP conducted under the Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Programme shall be taken into consideration for the fulfilment of the requirements as laid down in the Career Advancement Scheme as per UGC Regulations on Minimum qualifications for appointment of teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education 2018.
